

1937 Ford Deluxe "All Weather" 4-Door Convertible Sedan

Model Year History Overview:

In 1937 Ford adopted all-steel construction for its closed bodies discarding the fabric roof insert of the past. Evidence of streamlining was ample in the handsome new styling. Headlamps were now incorporated into the front fenders, the grille was stretched and sloped backwards at the top, and fine horizontal bars decorated the front end and hood sides. The result was one of the best looking cars of the decade. In 1937 Ford offered two 4-door convertible models: an "All Weather" and a "Phaeton". The "All Weather" had roll-down windows. In a year of questionable styling throughout the industry, Ford was a stand out.

This is a very rare '37 Ford 4-door All Weather convertible.
